Nominations by petition must be submitted to the secretary of the Board of Directors by February 14, 2023 (9401 West Broad St, Henrico, VA 23294). The petition must be accompanied by a statement of qualifications, biographical data and a certificate, signed by the nominee that they are agreeable to nomination and will serve if elected. There will be no nominations from the floor at the Annual Meeting unless at that time there are not sufficient nominees for the open Board positions. To be eligible to vote you must be a primary member of Henrico FCU or Bellwood CU and be at least 16 years of age.
